### **Minutes of the Meeting of the Board of Commissioners On July 8, 2026**

A meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the Lakeshore Crime Prevention District was held at 6:30 PM on Wednesday, July 8, 2026 at Mt. Carmel Academy, 7027 Milne Boulevard, New Orleans, Louisiana 70124. All participants attended in person.

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#### **1) Call to order**

Byron Casey called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. Mr. Casey confirmed the attendance of all commissioners listed above and that a quorum existed. Mr. Casey further confirmed that the public had been notified of the meeting in accordance with Louisiana's Open Meeting Laws.

#### **2) Minutes From Prior Meeting:**

A motion was made by Byron Casey to waive the reading and accept the minutes for the meeting of May 6, 2026. Susan Simon seconded the motion. A vote was taken and the motion was unanimously approved.

#### **3) Report Of Allied Security**

Santiago St. Clair from Allied Security reviewed the incident reports from May and June 2026. Mr. St. Clair reported in May and June that there had been no crime.

Mr. St. Clair presented that with the new agreement staffing issues were resolved. Mr. Casey requested an hour breakdown of which Mr. St. Clair reported 99.48% (?) of hours for patrol were filled. As there was not crime reported members of the audience mentioned that the drivers were patrolling the streets at a slower speed and were friendlier to neighbors.

5) **Board Members Business Reports & Feedback**

Susan Simon presented a copy of the Revenue and Expenditures Report for January 1, 2026 – June 30, 2026. Commissioner Simon moved to approve the updated budget and Commissioner Casey seconded the motion which passed.

Mr. Casey advised that the City of New Orleans was asking for the LCPD Budget for August 1 however the board usually sent the budget in after the September meeting on September 2, 2026.

Commissioner Casey brought up for discussion Resolution 2026-1 wherein LCPD requested an opinion from the State Attorney General that would allow LCPD to post minutes of the meeting on the website instead of publishing in the local newspaper. It was discussed as to the practicality of posting on the website and the cost savings by posting online. Upon further discussion Commissioner Simon moved and Commissioner Grevemberg 2<sup>nd</sup> and the motion passed.

6) **Adjournment:**

After confirming that there was no additional business, Byron Casey moved and Susan Simon seconded the motion to adjourn the meeting at 6:48 P.M. The next meeting is to be held on September 2, 2026 at 6:30 p.m.

**Resolution No. 2026-1**

*The undersigned Secretary of the Lakeshore Crime Prevention District (the "District") hereby certifies that:*

1. The Board of Commissions of the District duly called, convened and held a meeting on July 8, 2026 at Mount Carmel Academy, 7027 Milne Boulevard, New Orleans, Louisiana, and determined that a quorum was present.

2. Upon a motion duly made and seconded, the following resolutions were considered and discussed, after being read in full:

WHEREAS, pursuant to Act 200 adopted by the Louisiana Legislature during its 2004 Regular Session, the Lakeshore Crime Prevention District was created as a political subdivision of the State of Louisiana;

WHEREAS, La. R.S. §43:171 requires political subdivisions of the state to publish certain specified meeting minutes and financial statements (collectively, the "Required Information") annually in a local newspaper;

WHEREAS, in lieu of publishing the Required Information in a local newspaper, the District has instead (i) posted these materials on its website and (ii) advised the public of the availability of these posted materials through newsletters and announcements made at meetings of its Board of Commissioners held at least six times each year;

WHEREAS, the District has evaluated various factors bearing upon the public's access to the Required Information, including (i) the sharp decline in residents reading the local newspaper, (ii) rising expectations of the public to gain digital access to organizational records through website searches and (iii) the advantages of perpetual access to website data as opposed to transitory access to newspaper data;

WHEREAS, the District has determined that more members of the public gain access to the Required Information through web postings than through newspaper publications;

WHEREAS, the District (i) funds its operations through parcel fees assessed on property owners within the District, (ii) commits to spend all or substantially all of its limited financial resources on crime prevention and (iii) believes paying publication fees to a local newspaper is not the best use of the District's limited financial resources; and

WHEREAS, based on the foregoing, the District believes it is in the public's best interest for the District to continue its historic practice of posting the Required Information on its website in lieu of paying a local newspaper to disseminate such information.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Commissioners of the District hereby requests that, based on the District's above-listed determinations, the Louisiana Office of the Attorney General issue an advisory opinion that it would not object to the District continuing its historical practice of posting the Required Information on its website in lieu of publishing it pursuant to La. R.S. §43:171.

3. Each commissioner was polled with respect to the foregoing resolutions.
4. The foregoing resolutions were unanimously approved by the affirmative vote of all commissioners in attendance.
5. As of the date hereof, the foregoing resolutions have not been rescinded, and remain in full force and effect.
