Minutes of the Meeting of the Board of Commissioners On November 5, 2013

A meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the Lakeshore Crime Prevention District was held at 6:30 PM on Wednesday, November 5, 2013 , at Mt. Carmel Academy, 7027 Milne Boulevard, New Orleans, Louisiana 70124. All participants attended in person.

Commissioners Present: Nicholas Chetta II, James Grevemberg, Bonnie Nelson, Beverly S. Rizzo, Byron Casey, Dieter Hugel, Kenneth J. Najder, Susan Simon

Commissioners Absent: None

Guests Present: Tom Perrien, Ray Kleinpeter, Frank Meydrich, Jerry Aichen

Also present for a portion of the meeting (see below), Metro Security personnel, Lloyd Jarreau and Timothy Moffet.

Recording Secretary: Dieter Hugel

1) Call to order

Nicholas Chetta called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. Mr. Chetta confirmed the attendance of all commissioners listed above and that a quorum existed. Mr. Chetta further confirmed that the public had been notified of the meeting in accordance with Louisiana's Open Meeting Laws.

2) Minutes From Prior Meeting:

A motion was made by Byron Casey to waive the reading and accept the minutes for the meeting of September 4, 2013. Beverly Rizzo seconded the motion. A vote was taken and the motion was unanimously approved.

3) Report Of Metro Security

Lloyd Jarreau –of Metro reviewed the incident reports from September and October 2013 and provided handouts of the reports to all in attendance. Mr. Jarreau reported that there had been a report of a suspicious animal and that there had been a Suspicious Persons in both September and October. He reported that was a theft on Jade Street in October. Metro performed 974 drive by escorts

during the 2 month period as well as 6 dispatched escorts. Metro investigated 30 suspicious persons and vehicles and responded to 9 alarms during these two months. Metro also provided 20 residential checks for the 2 month period.

Mr. Jarreau announced that any if anyone sees any stray animals to call SPCA.

Mr. Jarreau advised that one of the guards had a brain aneurism and that a red Lincoln Town Car was targeting Metro Security Officers at various locations – License plate #149296 and to report any sightings to Metro at once.

Mr. Jarreau advised that there had been reports of shoplifting in the stores in the shopping center as well as automobile breakins in the parking lot so need to exercise caution with one's car.

Upon completion of Metro Security's report Nicholas Chetta announced the next meeting would be on January 8 at 6:30 p.m.

4) **LCPD Alumni Comments**

Due to need to discuss budget Alumni Comments were suspended for this meeting.

5) **Board Members Business Reports & Feedback**

A) Dieter Hugel: Discussed website: www.LAKESHORECRIMEPREVENTION.org Anticipate going "live" by beginning of 2014. Need input from other commissioners as respects content.

B) Susan Simon: Discussed 2014 Budget: Susan was projecting a surplus for 2013 of \$10,200 utilizing 98.5% of guard hours. Ken Najder moved and Byron Casey 2nd with unanimous approval for the budget at these figures.

There was discussion of number of guard hours to be utilized wherein Susan Simon recommended using 32 hours . Beverly Rizzo moved and Byron 2nd with unanimous approval for the guard hours at 32.

Beverly Rizzo asked if guard hours had increased however according to Susan Simons time was varied during busy times (i.e. holidays). Ken Najder questioned the revision of $(657 \text{ parcels} \times \$360 - 1.5\%) \times 98.5\% = \$230,642$

The newsletter would be revised to \$1,700.

Susan also reminded everyone on board that they needed to complete Ethics class by year end.

C) Ken Najder: Made a report from the LPOA ; Dave Meyers is the 2013 – 2014 President for LPOA. The infrastructure repairs under FEMA are to start in 2014 and end sometime in 2015. The Canal Blvd. repairs have now been moved to start in 2015 maybe late 2014. Mr. Najder also mentioned the USACE presentation to the LPOA membership regarding the permanent canal pump structures.

D) Nicholas Chetta: Brought up a potential new LSCPD Board member to fill the vacancy of Anna Maria Papania as to what should be the qualifications for the new member. Susan Simon recommended getting a resume'. Nick Chetta suggested candidates come early to the next meeting and leave so the present board can discuss and vote at the January meeting.

E) Bonnie Nelson: Holiday / Year End Newsletter to go out with 2 pages of tips regarding safeguarding home and automobile whilst shopping. The newsletter will mention website to go live by year end. Also the crime in the shopping area will be mentioned. The newsletter will be mailed by end of November – beginning of December.

F) Beverly Rizzo: Discussed Women's Club and that they had a meeting next week. There had been no complaints regarding LSCPD.


G) James Grevemberg: No Report

I) All: The next meeting was set for January 8, 2014 due to the first Wednesday being New Year's Day.

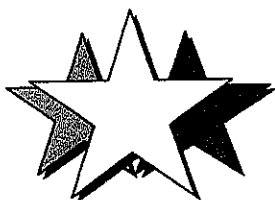
7) **Adjournment:**

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the District is authorized to fix the amount of such annual fee, up to a maximum of \$360; and

WHEREAS, in connection with the preparation of the 2014 budget provided for below, the Board desires to fix the District's annual parcel fee for 2014 at \$360;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the New Orleans City Council is hereby requested to impose and collect a fee for 2014 of \$360 on each improved and unimproved parcel of land located within the District.

II. ADOPTION OF 2014 BUDGET

WHEREAS, the Local Government Budget Act of the State of Louisiana requires the District to adopt a budget for 2014; and

WHEREAS, the District desires to adopt a budget indicating its anticipated uses of the proceeds of the 2014 parcel fees authorized above;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board hereby adopts the following as the District's 2014 budget:
